THE NEXT RENEWAL CYCLE IS IN FULL SWING August 1, 2019 – July 31, 2021 (pursuant to rule 62-531.330(3), F.A.C)

Don't wait until the last minute to accrue the required 12 CE credits you need to renew your license in 2021. Approved coursework is posted to the FWWA Website weekly. To view available courses, visit www.flwwceu.org. As a reminder, a minimum of six (6) coursework hours must be in the rules/well construction category (R/R) and no more than six (6) coursework hours may be in the business/safety practices category (S/B). A maximum of six (6) coursework hours for CE credit may be obtained online.

Depending on current government regulations and stay-at-home orders, you will receive notice from your respective Water Management District and the FWWA of changes to obtaining credits online. As of today, July 16, 2020, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection has not extended online hours for contractors with an active license.

HOW TO GET COURSEWORK APPROVED THAT IS NOT PRE-APPROVED THROUGH THE FWWA

Obtaining Continuing Education Credits (CECs) from non-approved providers, whether in Florida or out-of-state, is possible if you are proactive. It is good practice before you spend the time and the money to attend a course or continuing education event, to gather the information on the course(s) and send to the Florida Water Well Administrator for review. There is a strict criterion that the course must contain. To have your course reviewed prior to attending, please complete steps 1-3 below. If you are submitting the information post-coursework completion, please complete all steps below.

- 1. Coursework agenda. This should include a breakdown of the timeline for the course.
- 2. Detailed coursework description/summary of each coursework hour attended for CE credit.
- 3. Coursework instructor(s) biography or resume.
- 4. If sending documentation post-coursework, a Certificate of Attendance or letter from provider confirming completion of course is required. This must include the date, time and location of course as well as the contractors name and license number (if applicable).

All non-approved coursework will be reviewed by the Florida Water Well Administrator. Approval/denial will be based on the above mandatory criteria submitted by the contractor or person seeking licensure. It is the responsibility of the individual seeking licensure or license renewal to send the required materials to the FWWA for review.

HOW TO CHECK THE STATUS OF YOUR CE CREDITS

All licensed Water Well Contractors and those seeking licensure can view the status of their credits on the Florida Water Well Administrators Website, www.flwwceu.org. Follow these steps to ensure your credits are listed properly:

- 1. Visit www.flwwceu.org and click on the CE Credits tab at the top.
- 2. Select the cycle you are currently obtaining credits for.
- Credits are listed by water well contractors last name, alphabetically. You may also search for your last name in the search bar
- 4. If you do not see your name on the list and think you should have credits listed, it could possibly be because of the following reasons:
 - a. We do not have a copy of your certificate of attendance forms from the courses you completed
 - b. You did not pay the conversion fee of \$14 per credit hour
 - c. Your license went into the inactive status with the Water Management District (WMD) and although you have obtained CE credits and paid conversion fees, we need confirmation from the WMD to change your status back to Active.

WELL CONTRACTOR LICENSE NUMBER

Contractor's license number shall be continuously displayed in a conspicuous place on both sides of each piece of drilling equipment owned, leased, or operated by the contractor. The number shall be easily readable by a person with normal vision and shall be in a color which will contrast with its background. The number shall be presented in numerals not less than two inches high.
