DON'T FORGET TO PROVIDE US WITH YOUR UPDATED CONTACT INFORMATION

As we enter 2019, the Florida Water Well Administrator (FWWA) will be cleaning up their database and making necessary changes for the approach of the next renewal cycle. To assist us and ensure you continue to receive communication from the FWWA regarding your Water Well Contractors License, please make sure your contact information remains up-to-date.

How can you help:

- 1. When submitting your coursework forms, please make sure contact information on the forms is up-to-date as we will use this to correct any issues in our system.
- 2. If you have moved and changed your address with the Postal Service, please make sure to share this information with the FWWA.
- 3. We recommend you provide us with your personal/home information as we are aware changes occur in the job field. If your business information is on file, mailing address, business phone, email, etc., please make sure to contact our office to update your information.

THE NEXT RENEWAL CYCLE IS IN FULL SWING August 1, 2017 – July 31, 2019 (pursuant to rule 62-531.330(3), F.A.C)

Don't wait until the last minute to accrue the required 12 CE credits you need to renew your license in 2019. Approved coursework is posted to the FWWA Website weekly. To view available courses, visit www.flwwceu.org. As a reminder, a minimum of six (6) coursework hours must be in the rules/well construction category (R/R) and no more than six (6) coursework hours may be in the business/safety practices category (S/B). HOW TO CHECK THE STATUS OF YOUR CE CREDITS

All licensed Water Well Contractors and those seeking licensure can view the status of their credits on the Florida Water Well Administrators Website, www.flwwceu.org. Follow these steps to ensure your credits are listed properly:

- 1. Visit www.flwwceu.org and click on the CE Credits tab at the top.
- 2. Select the cycle you are currently obtaining credits for.
- Credits are listed by water well contractors last name, alphabetically. You may also search for your last name in the search bar
- 4. If you do not see your name on the list and think you should have credits listed, it could possibly be because of the following reasons:
 - a) We do not have a copy of your certificate of attendance forms from the courses you completed
 - b) You did not pay the conversion fee of \$14 per credit hour
 - c) Your license went into the inactive status with the Water Management District (WMD) and although you have obtained CE credits and paid conversion fees, we need confirmation from the WMD to change your status back to Active.
 - d) You recently submitted your certificates and conversion fees and have not allowed ample time for processing; approximately 5-7 business days to update to the website.

If you went through the steps above and believe your credits are inaccurate or not currently listed on the website, please call the Administrator directly at 844-359-9238.

REMINDER: ENVIRONMENTAL PERMIT STREAMLINING

In 2013, a bill was passed that revised numerous provisions relating to environmental permit streamlining. The bill states "upon authorization from the department, issuance of well permits will be the sole responsibility of the water management district, delegated local government, or local county health department. Other local governmental entities may not impose additional or duplicate requirements or fees or establish a separate program for the permitting of the location, abandonment, boring, or other activities reasonably associated with the installation and abandonment of a groundwater well."

ILLEGAL DRILLING IS COSTLY

Water Management District's may impose through an order an administrative fine not to exceed \$5,000 per occurrence against an unlicensed person if it determines that the unlicensed person has engaged in the practice of water well contracting for which a license is required.

For more information on disciplinary guidelines, adoption and enforcement, and license suspension or revocation, please view Chapter 373.333 of the Florida Statute.

WELL CONTRACTOR LICENSE NUMBER

Contractor's license number shall be continuously displayed in a conspicuous place on both sides of each piece of drilling equipment owned, leased, or operated by the contractor. The number shall be easily readable by a person with normal vision and shall be in a color which will contrast with its background. The number shall be presented in numerals not less than two inches high.
